
The Epiphany of our Lord January 6, 2024


Light all the candles on the Advent wreath and as many other candles as practical.

⁷Of this gospel I was made a minister according to the gift of God's grace, which was given me by the working of his power. ⁸To me, though I am the very least of all the saints, this grace was given, to preach to the Gentiles the unsearchable riches of Christ, ⁹and to bring to light for everyone what is the plan of the mystery hidden for ages in God who created all things, ¹⁰so that through the church the manifold wisdom of God might now be made known to the rulers and authorities in the heavenly places. ¹¹This was according to the eternal purpose that he has realized in Christ Jesus our Lord, ¹²in whom we have boldness and access with confidence through our faith in him.

⁷Then Herod summoned the wise men secretly and ascertained from them what time the star had appeared. ⁸And he sent them to Bethlehem, saying, "Go and search diligently for the child, and when you have found him, bring me word, that I too may come and worship him." ⁹After listening to the king, they went on their way. And behold, the star that they had seen when it rose went before them until it came to rest over the place where the child was. ¹⁰When they saw the star, they rejoiced exceedingly with great joy. ¹¹And going into the house they saw the child with Mary his mother, and they fell down and worshiped him. Then, opening their treasures, they offered him gifts, gold and frankincense and myrrh. ¹²And being warned in a dream not to return to Herod, they departed to their own country by another way.

The third day He rose again from the dead. He ascended into heaven and sits at the right hand of God the Father




From thence He will come to judge the living and the dead.

Devotional thoughts:

On January 14th, one of America's greatest superstars of all time will celebrate his birthday! On that day, Don Gartlits will turn 92 years old!

Don Gartlits is not a movie star or a rock star. He is not a baseball, football, basketball, or hockey star. But if you grew up in the '60s or '70s listening to WLS radio, you will never forget him because of this commercial, "Sunday, Sunday, Sunday at beautiful US 30 drag strip with 'Big Daddy' Don Gartlits. Where the great ones run, run, run."

"Big Daddy" Don Gartlits is a pioneer in the field of drag racing. He is credited with perfecting the rear-engine Top Fuel dragster.

Don Gartlits was the first drag racer to officially surpass the 170, 180, 200, 240, 250, and 270 mile-per-hour in the quarter mile! He was also the first to top 200 mph in the 1/8 mi!

Why, you ask, are you talking about "Big Daddy" Don Gartlits on this celebration of The Epiphany of our Lord? Let me explain. It all has to do with Matthew 2:10 from our Gospel lesson for Epiphany, "When they saw the star, they rejoiced exceedingly with great joy."

This little praise "They rejoiced exceedingly with great joy" is very interesting. It seems that Matthew really wants to draw your attention to the joy experienced by the wise men when they saw the star. A literal word-for-word translation of that phrase from the Greek language might go something like this, "The rejoiced with joy mega exceedingly." The word that really caught my attention was "exceedingly." This word in Greek is "sphodra" $(\sigma\phi\delta\rho\alpha)$. In studying this little word, I came to the conclusion that "exceedingly" really doesn't do it justice.

Lexicons tell us that it means, "excessive, vehement, or violent." It has the force of "all out", "to the max", or "with total effort!" In Star Trek terms, Scotty might explain *sphodra* this way, "I'm giving her all she's got, Captain."

Another way to explain this verse is to translate it this way, "When they saw the star, they rejoiced with great 'pedal to the metal' joy!" This is how I came up with "Big Daddy" Don Gartlits. In my mind's eye, I can see a Top Fuel dragster explode from the starting line of Smokin' US 30 Drag Strip. I realized that is the kind of intense joy experienced by the wise men on their way to find the one "who has been born king of the Jews."

Some years ago, I was given the gift of a devotion-a-day calendar written by one of America's top evangelical pastors. I started faithfully to read each daily devotion. Unfortunately, when I got to the reading for January 6, my heart sank. On this most wonderful day of the Epiphany of our Lord, there was no mention of the wise men or their rejoicing with "pedal to the metal" great joy. I couldn't go on.

The wise men had this exceedingly great joy not because of the star itself but because they knew that the star would lead them to the newborn King.

When they went into the house and found baby Jesus, they could not contain themselves! They immediately fell down and worshiped Him. They gave Him gifts of gold and frankincense and myrrh. As much as I would like to, I'm not going to explore the importance of Epiphany gifts but the source of their joy and ours.

The Greek word for wise men is magi (magoi, $\mu\acute{a}\gamma$ oı). They came from beyond the eastern limits of the Roman Empire.

The magi were the scholars of their day. They may have been familiar with Hebrew Scriptures. However, God revealed to them a mystery that no one could discover through human reason or research. He revealed to them the Savior of the world. God led them to the Savior of the world through the miracle of a star. This was their great Epiphany. They rejoiced with exceedingly great joy!

You and I, too have had an Epiphany. God has revealed to us something that human wisdom could never discover.

The Apostle Paul put it this way in 2 Timothy 1:9-10:

"⁹ [God] saved us and called us to a holy calling, not because of our works but because of his own purpose and grace, which he gave us in Christ Jesus before the ages began, ¹⁰ and which now has been manifested through the appearing [EPIPHANY] of our Savior Christ Jesus, who abolished death and brought life and immortality to light through the gospel."

This is our great Epiphany. God saved us, not because of our works but because of His grace through the Epiphany of our Savior Who abolished death and brought life and immortality to light through the Gospel! Can you think of any greater reason for us to "rejoice with exceedingly great joy"? Is not Epiphany a time for us to rejoice with "great 'pedal to the metal' joy!"?

The great Epiphany revealed to us in the Bible is that God loves us! The Apostle John writes in 1 John 4:7-12,

"⁷Beloved, let us love one another, for love is from God, and whoever loves has been born of God and knows God. ⁸ Anyone who does not love does not know God, because God is love. ⁹ In this the love of God was made *manifest* among us, that God sent his only Son into the world, so that we might live through him. ¹⁰ In this is love, not that we have loved God but that he loved us and sent his Son to be the propitiation for our sins. ¹¹ Beloved, if God so loved us, we also ought to love one another. ¹² No one has ever seen God; if we love one another, God abides in us and his love is perfected in us."

"Rejoice in the Lord always; again I will say, rejoice. Let your reasonableness be known to everyone. The Lord is at hand; do not be anxious about anything, but in everything by prayer and supplication with thanksgiving let your requests be made known to God. And the peace of God, which surpasses all understanding, will guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus" (Philippians 4:4-7). God's richest blessings to you in Christ.

Direct us by Your Spirit that we may daily grow in grace and in the knowledge of our Savior until we shall stand before You in the joy of everlasting glory; through the same Jesus Christ, our Lord, who lives and reigns with You and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever.


